

If you are looking to train as a fully qualified electrician installing in commercial, industrial and domestic locations, this City & Guilds 8202-30 course could be for you. This is now the default qualification for the traditional route to becoming an electrician.

Please note on completion of the course you will hold the status of Electrician's Mate.

COURSE DETAILS

The course covers the following subjects:-

- Commercial such as supermarkets, offices, warehouses, schools, shops, restaurants and hospitals.
- Industrial such as research/development parks, heavy manufacturing, buildings and factories.
- Domestic such as houses, flats, bungalows, renewable and solar PV.
- Agricultural farms.
- Maintenance services and local authorities.
- Media Electricians required for the day to day running operations in television and radio.
- Sporting venues theatres, concert halls and stadium events.

ENTRY GUIDELINES

This is a Study Programme for those aged 16-18 years of age.

Level 2 Diploma in Electrical Installations (Buildings and Structures) (2365-02) or equivalent and Grade 9-4 (A*-C) or equivalent in Maths.
